- E. Maryann Zogby 9 Bolton Road one more person that would like to go on record to say how opposed she is to the business on 41 Bolton Road not zoned for it appreciates the efforts by the Board
- F. TOWN ATTORNEY HERBERT CULLY as everyone is aware, Sitrin has made several efforts to come forward and secure a building permit to go in and do work at the Bolton Road property. Lary Gell is consistently, as well as Herb, rejected any applications that they made on the basis (as per the Board Resolution made a few months ago) that there was a defect in the application that they came forward with in that they had said four (4) residents. Later we learned it was five (5) residents and four (4) bedrooms. Additionally, there is a serious question as to the document that they gave us showing a concentration of other homes (one that Herb saw was outdated from 4 or 5 years ago). We had FOILED a more current one and never received a response. Sitrin has now retained Bond, Schoeneck & King, PLLC (Syracuse) and they have brought an article 78 action against the Town.; Article 78 action is a lawsuit to compel an officer to perform an act they feel they should perform and, in this case, it is to compel the Town to

issue a building permit to allow them to go forward and develop this property. They have to show that the Board was arbitrary in making a decision not to allow this to go forward. (Herb) doesn't feel it is arbitrary for several reasons: first and foremost – if it is four (4) individuals, it could be a two bedroom – seen the plans – it is built on a slab – there is no basement – rendering that was seen says three (3) bedrooms exist now so they in essence, they will be creating another bedroom and whether they say five (5) – they can go up to eight (8) with double occupancy in each of the rooms. One of the things Sitrin is raising is that we did not object within the 40 days. My position is, what was presented to us is not in fact what they intend to do and that's is the information I am going to present to the judge – the judge has extended it to October 12, 2022. Sitrin gave some cases in their submission. The over concentration is quite old and they did not provide a current list. You are also taking a very quiet, residential neighborhood and extremely narrow. The Town Board will keep the residents posted as we move forward.

- G. Lisa Sowich 116 Sedgewick Park attending the July 13<sup>th</sup> meeting road conditions on Sedgewick Park – road breaking away – gravel all over – appreciated the Boards help; Supervisor Miscione – within the next couple weeks, when start paving, it is on the list to be taken care of.
- H. Sara Chetnick 14 Hoffman Road Senior Center Surveys; Councilman Lenart will provided the summary of the surveys to the Clerk's Office to be picked up; Residents asked if anything could be told of what is on the survey; Councilman Lenart nothing new to be told that we haven't heard before
- I. Martha Smith Roberts Road Senior Center spoke about money allocated for the Senior Center and why not spend for the Senior Center for staff so can be open, especially for a cooling center to go and have a meal and socialize; it was hot and we needed it to really be open
- J. Supervisor Miscione Highway Superintendent Richard Sherman had a suggestion and spoke with the Parkway Senior Center they are fully open and functional, own director and staff there work on something with them together and add to their people who are currently there. We reached out to a few other Senior Centers.; Marge spoke with Kelly at the Parkway Senior Center and yes, anyone can come there but we are New Hartford, we don't understand why can't have here, we don't want to go North Utica either; Supervisor Miscione there are more people in one location vs five to six people just in New Hartford and have their own director, own people, own membership Yes, you pay to join we will be working with them; Councilman Messa approx. 40 residents go to New York Mills and 40 go to the Parkway that is 80 that are not coming here trying to make sense of this they are not here in New Hartford.; Marge we have been closed; Councilman Messa they are doing things that we don't do; Supervisor Miscione these other programs have a working successful program, that works and makes sense for everyone it is not so far away there are people that do live just as close as here;

Councilman Reynolds suggested opening one (1) or two (2) days a week to restart our program – working on a few options to keep it here in New Hartford; Councilman Lenart - before we do that, we have had some incidents in the past - rules and regulations are not being followed, there is no definite procedures for people working in the office or when we contact police for assistance. Before we open that, we should have an established plan going forward so when something happens everyone knows who to call and what to do – because the behavior that has be exhibited in the past is not acceptable by people working here and not acceptable to the people (public) that come in to do business. Before we do anything, we need an established plan with the police department and department heads to figure out what the next steps are. Once we have that, we will explain to the people exactly what will and will not happen if those policy and procedures are not followed; Marth Smith – realize seniors are not quiet – programs involve noise (music as entertainment, for exercising); Councilman Lenart – talking about following the rules and regulations that were established for everyone and they were not followed and there were inactions with the Clerk's that were not becoming; Marge – he is talking about me the day I came in to use it as a cooling center; Supervisor Miscione – going on record that he spoke to the County – they had the address for the cooling station as St. John's for over six (6) years ago, this building was never a cooling station – when you came here, it wasn't because you got permission from the County – the County even said it was up to the Town if we even are a cooling station; we need a plan – we cannot have six (6) employees paid to have six (6) patrons in the Senior Center – we needed a plan and still today we don't have a real plan; Marge – we are not addressing to be paid, we are addressing to getting open for exercising; Supervisor Miscione – three (3) or four (4) months ago it was said you can open and volunteer right now and then everyone went on strike because we're not getting paid and walked out. Looking for plan to make sense for all the residents in the Town who pay taxes to use the money for that. The building saved the Town a lot of money and put everyone in one building. The place was packed when we had a Director and she retired. We need people to come in and spend the money wisely. If we want to work with the Parkway Senior Center we would pay the fee for the residents, the director there does a wonderful job. We would work with them for one lump sum price – give one fee for New Hartford residents – cost effective; Councilman Lenart – for seniors to make a blanket statement that we are going to pay for everything is not fair to the tax payers of New Hartford. For the last eight (8) month we have been hearing about nutrition and socialization and we are giving you that opportunity and again you are turning that down, so it is very difficult and work and try to develop a plan but everything that we hear is that it has to be in the Village of New Hartford and have to have meals five (5) days a week and have to be paid. If it is that important to be in the Village of New Hartford, suggest going to the Village Board and see if they will support you. We have a facility here and we're more than willing to have people come and do what they had to do, again, behavior that was exhibited over the last times people were here was not acceptable; Resident – Marge already said she knows, she was taking signs down and had law enforcement escort her out; Councilman Lenart - no they did not escort her out – what we are trying to do is to provide you the issues that you raised and

do immediately and you are choosing not to do that – free membership and can start tomorrow; Councilman Messa – other Senior Centers are open one – two days a week... the pandemic - mentioned safety of the Seniors – big thing – looking forward. Did say at one of the meetings didn't want to open because of this pandemic. April had another big surge. We need to keep the safety of the Seniors on the table, that is a big issue. The point is, we are trying to find something accommodates all the needs – people call and say they don't like this location – nothing we can do about that – set up a 501C3 – have your own group; a resident stated it is \$450.00 only and you don't have to hire an accountant, all you need is a treasury and a president and terribly easy; Supervisor Miscione – thank you everyone
